Back in the summer of 2006, I had the opportunity to visit Scotland in the United Kingdom. It

was an incredible time for me on many different levels because of the Presbyterian heritage in that place (to stand in the pulpit where John Knox preached), the fact that the FIFA World Cup Soccer Finals were going on in Germany, and because I was traveling with my older sister whom I so rarely get to see.

I have heard more than once that the church is no more than a generation away from extinction.

There was an evening where LeAnn and I left our hotel in downtown Glasgow to go to a restaurant/banquet hall to attend a dinner hosted by the Dental Association of Scotland. Allow me to mention that my sister is a practicing dentist in Seattle, Washington and was there for a lecture series...I was there for the food. Moving on, as our cab approached the restaurant named "Oran Mor", I became speechless at the architecture alone. This beautiful gothic building made of stone with amazing stained glass windows depicting the movements of Christ through the Scriptures and the great Reformers of history had a full bar in the basement and tables for two hundred in the Sanctuary. My sister gasped as we entered and stated, "This is a great place for a restaurant!" My reply was, "It is a better place for a Church." The irony in all of this is that "Oran Mor" was the original name of the Church translated from the Gaelic, "The Great Song". The only question worth asking is, "What happened to that "Great Song" of that beautiful Church?

I have heard more than once that the church is no more than a generation away from extinction. This is a statement that comes with the baggage of shock value and I disagree with it on many levels. If we are referring to the Church as the "body of Christ", then I think that we are giving humanity

way too much credit in thinking that people could destroy a community of faith when faith is solely a gift of God alone. If we are referring though to a particular group within that community of faith though (a particular congregation), then I would have to agree (with great sadness) that churches run the risk of being a generation away from extinction. Churches always run the risk of having their "Great Song", their "Oran Mor", to fall on deaf ears and never to be sung again.

I share all of this with you not to put fear in your hearts, but instead for us as the Pleasant Ridge Presbyterian Church to consistently and constantly turn to our Eternal Choir Director (No, I am not making reference to Dr. Tom Merrill as much as we all love and appreciate him!) who alone can put a new song in our mouths...a song of praise to our God. In response to what God has done through Jesus Christ at 5950 Montgomery Road for over two hundred years, we need to join in the choir and sing the "Great Song" that is ours and ours alone. Whether this is through prayer, giving to the painting fund (it is good to see ladders on the perimeter of the church and the painting job started!), called leadership (Elders and Deacons), your time and talents, smiles, worship attendance, and your treasure (pledging...please note that we are behind for the year and summer is approaching), we need to sing the "Oran Mor" that God has put in our mouths.

Churches always run the risk of having their "Great Song".....fall on deaf ears and never to be sung again.

And when they come in or when they pass by, what will they say? What a great place for a restaurant? No. They will say, "What a great place for a church!"

What will matter is not your competence but your character.

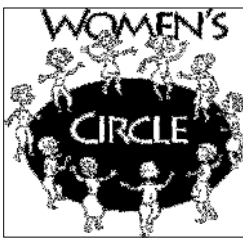
*What will matter is not how many people you knew,

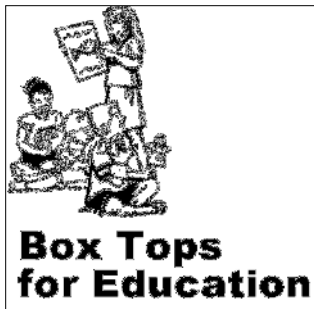

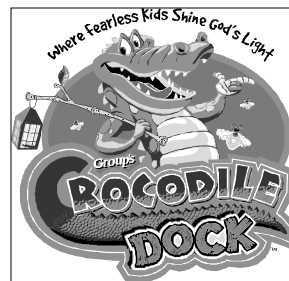
VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

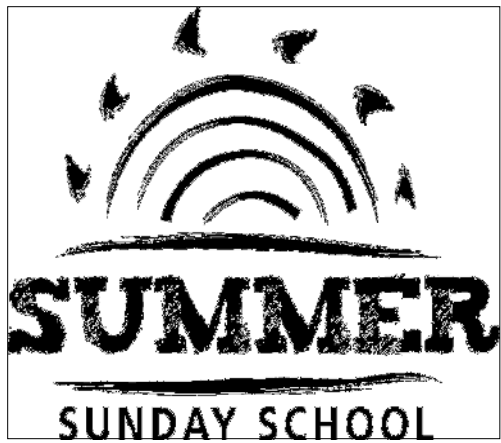

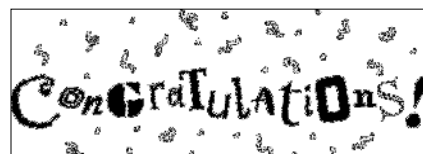
